## Today's Readings

### **First Reading** (*Ezekiel 2:2-5*)

As the Lord spoke to me, the Spirit entered into me and set me on my feet, and I heard the one who was speaking say to me: Son of man, I am sending you to the Israelites, rebels who have rebelled against Me; they and their ancestors have revolted against me to this very day. Hard of face and obstinate of heart are they to whom I am sending you. But you shall say to them: Thus says the Lord God! And whether they heed or resist-for they are a rebellious house-they shall know that a prophet has been among them.

### **Responsorial Psalm** (*Psalm 123:1-2, 2,3-4*)

### **Second Reading** (*2 Corinthians 12:7-10*)

Brothers and sisters; That I, Paul, might not become too elated, because of the abundance of the revelations, a thorn in the flesh was given to me, an angel of Satan, to beat me, to keep me from being too elated. Three times I begged the Lord about this, that it might leave me, but He said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." I will rather boast most gladly of my weaknesses, in order that the power of Christ may dwell with me. Therefore, I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and constraints, for the sake of Christ; for when I am weak, then I am strong.

### **Gospel** (*Mark 6:1-6a*)

Jesus departed from there and came to his native place, accompanied by His disciples. When the sabbath came He began to teach in the synagogue, and many who heard Him were astonished. They said, "Where did this man get all this? What kind of wisdom has been given him? What mighty deeds are wrought by His hands! Is He not the carpenter, the Son of Mary, and brother of James and Joses and Judas and Simon? And are not His sisters here with us?" As they took offense at Him. Jesus said to them, "A prophet is not without honor except in his native place and among his own kin and in his own house." So He was not able to perform any mighty deed there, apart from curing a few sick people by laying His hands on them. He was amazed at their lack of faith.

## Gospel Reflection

Today's readings introduce Jesus as a prophet and explain how prophets and other messengers from God inevitably suffer rejection. The readings challenge us to face rejection and hardship with prophetic courage.

In the Gospel we come across three reactions to Jesus's ministry by his own people. First, they are surprised at the knowledge that he exhibited through his preaching in the synagogue at Nazareth. They know that, in Capernaum, Jesus expressed his admiration for the gesture of four men who brought down the roof of a house to introduce a paralytic (Mk 2:4). He approved their action because it was a sign that the House of Israel was to be accessible to the marginalized. He was moving with sinners and joined in their banquet as a symbol of the kingdom of God (Mk 2:15-17). He touched the lepers and made them pure, fit to belong to his new family (Mk 1:41), provided that they remain seated around him, listen to his word and put it into practice. These type of teaching and approach were scandals for the villagers.

Secondly, they stumble at the thought that he is one of them. For the people of Nazareth, Jesus grew up, like one of them, in a family with solid religious principles, belonged to the chosen people, followed in the faith of their fathers and sat at the feet of the rabbis to listen to the Torah.

Thirdly, they show disbelief in him. The people of Nazareth rejected Jesus because their perception of Jesus was based on their knowledge of his past life, as a carpenter's son. In spite of listening to him speak with God's power and authority, they failed to perceive him as the Son of God. As a result, Jesus could not work many miracles there. The people of Nazareth were ultimate losers for resisting God's plan and his power manifested in Jesus.


