

Gospel Reflection

Divine Providence is not simply a matter of knowing God's generosity but experiencing His unconditional love and constant care in providing for our needs. A) **God provides us unconditionally:** In the First Reading we hear about the free gift of God's mercy. He invites His faithful to come, eat and drink from his hands irrespective of our individual status. Anyone can approach God for His love. No one is a stranger at His door. B) **God provides us in season and out of season:** St. Paul exhorts the Romans to recognize the depth of Jesus's love for them. Nothing can separate us from the love of Christ. Nothing can be an obstacle to God's generosity and providence. C) **God provides us in abundance:** The Gospel presents an actual life situation in which Jesus feeds five thousand people. The compassion which flowed from the meek and humble heart of Jesus, the number of people who enjoyed this divine providence, and the number of baskets left over only indicate the superabundance of God's mercy.

First Reading (Isaiah 55:1-3)

Thus says the Lord: All you who are thirsty, come to the waters! You who have no money, come, receive grain and eat; come, without paying and without cost, drink wine and milk. Why spend your money for what is not bread, your wages for what fails to satisfy? Heed me and you shall eat well, and you shall delight in rich fare. Come to me heedfully, listen that you may have life. I will renew with you the everlasting covenant, the benefit assured to David.

Second Reading (Romans 8:35, 37-39)

Brothers and Sisters: What will separate us from the love of Christ? Will anguish, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? No, in all these things we conquer overwhelmingly through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor present things, nor future things, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Gospel (Matthew 14:13-21)

When Jesus heard of the death of John the Baptist, he withdrew in a boat to a deserted place by himself. The crowds heard of this and followed him on foot from the towns. When he disembarked and saw a vast crowd; his heart was moved with pity for them and he cured their sick. When it was evening, the disciples approached him and said, "This is a deserted place, and it is already late; dismiss the crowds so that they can go to the villages and buy food for themselves." Jesus said to them, "there is no need for them to go away; give them some food your-selves." But they said to him, "Five loaves and two fish are all we have here." Then he said, "Bring them here to me." And he ordered the crowds to sit down on the grass. Taking the five loaves and the two fish, and looking up to heaven, he said the blessing, broke the loaves, and gave them to the disciples, who in turn gave them to the crowds. They all ate and were satisfied; and they picked up the fragments left over- twelve wicker baskets full. Those who ate were about five thousand men, not counting women and children.
