Gospel Reflection

Job of the first reading knows from the experience that life on earth is extremely painful. Many of us agree with it. This understanding of human life should prompt us to come to the help of those who suffer from poverty, sickness, family discord, social injustice, or in any other form of anxiety. Jesus' message is meant to bring meaning and purpose into the lives of such people, holding out joy. That was why St. Paul was happy to preach. The hope it generates builds self confidence in communities and a longing to search for creative ways to address their own problems. One good deed prompts another. Peter's mother in law is healed, she sets about serving others immediately. Many more healings take place. But unbroken success can dim the vision. We need to withdraw to the Father for a while, who put our inner vision right, recharges our energies and enables us to return to our work with renewed vitality. Jesus proceeds to other villages to preach rather than return to his field of success to be acclaimed a hero. He knows that other villages need him. His messages of tireless work ought to stir us to action when we prefer to stand aside and take rest, criticize or search for appreciation.

Today's Readings

First Reading (*Job 7:1-4, 6-7 (74B)*)

Job spoke, saying: Is not man's life on earth a drudgery? Are not his days those of hirelings? He is a slave who longs for the shade, a hireling who waits for his wages. So I have been assigned months of misery, and troubled nights have been allotted to me. If in bed I say, "When shall I arise?" then the night drags on; I am filled with restlessness until the dawn. My days are swifter than a weaver's shuttle; they come to an end without hope. Remember that my life is like the wind; I shall not see happiness again.

Second Reading (*1 Corinthians. 9:16-19,22-23*)

Brothers and sisters: If I preach the gospel, this is no reason for me to boast, for an obligation has been imposed on me, and woe to me if I do not preach it! If I do so willingly, I have a recompense, but if unwillingly, then I have been entrusted with a stewardship. What then is my recompense? That, when I preach, I offer the gospel free of charge so as not to make full use of my right in the gospel.

Although I am free in regard to all, I have made myself a slave to all so as to win over as many as possible. To the weak I became weak, to win over the weak. I have become all things to all, to save at least some. All this I do for the sake of the gospel, so that I too may have a share in it.

Gospel (*Mark 1:29-39*)

On leaving the synagogue Jesus entered the house of Simon and Andrew with James and John. Simon's mother-in-law lay sick with a fever. They immediately told him about her. He approached, grasped her hand, and helped her up. Then the fever left her and she waited on them.

When it was evening, after sunset, they brought to him all who were ill or possessed by demons. The whole town was gathered at the door. He cured many who were sick with various diseases, and he drove out many demons, not permitting them to speak because they knew him.

Rising very early before dawn, he left and went off to a deserted place, where he prayed. Simon and those who were with him pursued him and on finding him said, "Everyone is looking for you." He told them, "Let us go on to the nearby villages that I may preach there also. For this purpose have I come." So he went into their synagogues, preaching and driving out demons throughout the whole of Galilee.
